BA IN HISTORY

Our program gives you the opportunity to study state power, ethnic and religious conflict, sexual oppression, racial hierarchies, and wealth and war in the fields of American, European, Asian, African, Latin American, and Middle Eastern history. This program provides students with an excellent preparation for law school, graduate work, teaching, and a variety of private and public service positions.

The history major is linked to graduate programs within Pace, such as the Pre-Law curriculum, the Master of Public Administration, and the Master of Science in Teaching. We are also affiliated with the Global Asia Institute.

BA IN GLOBAL ASIA STUDIES

Broaden your cultural understanding of the world's largest continent and prepare yourself for a fruitful career in an increasingly globalized world with this program. It is a multidisciplinary one in which you will have the option to choose either an Asian Languages and Cultures track or a Comparative Asian Studies track.

BA IN LATIN AMERICAN STUDIES

This major is built on a foundation of cross-disciplinary learning communities focused on themes of culture, society, cinema, economic development, and politics. It is strengthened by required courses yet flexible enough to offer you a multitude of choices in each theme area. Innovative aspects include interdisciplinary teaching, travel and cultural courses, internships, and civic engagement.
