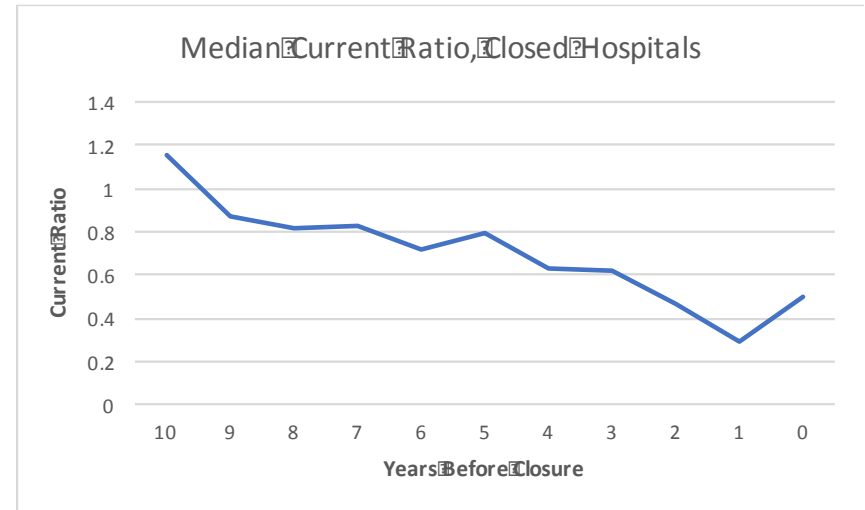

### Research Questions:

- RQ1:** Can hospital failures be predicted using standard financial indicators?
- RQ2:** Do these indicators vary by hospital characteristics (e.g. urban/rural, poverty level)?
